## MINUTES OF THE STUDY SESSION OF THE BRIGHTON CITY COUNCIL HELD ON MAY 3, 2018

### STUDY SESSION

Mayor Muzzin called the Study Session to order at 6:30 p.m.

Present were Mayor Muzzin, Councilmembers: Bohn, Emaus, Gardner, Pettengill, and Pipoly. Absent was Councilmember Tobbe. Staff: City Manager Nate Geinzer, Attorney Paul Burns, City Clerk Tara Brown, DPW Director Marcel Goch, Deputy Chief of Police Craig Flood, Utilities Director Tim Krugh, Assistant to the City Manager/DDA Coordinator Brandon Skopek, Finance Director Gretchen Gomolka, and Building Department Clerk Wendy Ayala. There were 3 persons in the audience.

### CALL TO PUBLIC

Mayor Muzzin opened the Call to the Public at 6:30 p.m. with no response.

### **Discussion of Waste Management Contract and Services**

Council and staff discussed the \$.80 increase per month per user for waste removal. DPW Director Goch feels this price is competitive. Waste Management has been the City's waste hauler for 19 years. Councilmember Bohn is very concerned with leaky trucks, whether it is hydraulic oil or garbage he would like to see it addressed.

Patrick Greve, Waste Management Public Services, thanked Council for the opportunity to serve the community. He then spoke about the procedures and maintenance involved with the day to day activity and one of the items that is always on the waste haulers minds is leaks. The haulers complete visual inspections and post trip daily vehicle inspection reports to insure all machinery and vehicles are performing properly. If there are any issues, the repairs are made at night. If there are any large issues, the hauler is instructed to call for another truck. Most times, he finds that the leaks are compost material.

### **Discussion of Utility Rates for FY 2018/19**

Council and staff discussed the utility rate for fiscal year 2018/2018 and the waste water asset management plan.
